The Attackers: System Testing, the Relationship between Management & Labor: Management Must Be Fair, Labor Must Be Productive, Both Must be Impartial, Col 3:23–25; Disaster Testing: Personal: Exigencies of Life & Natural Phenomena; Collective: Cultural Decline & Historical Downtrends; Prosperity Testing: Individual & Collective: Loss of Thought

- 30. This doctrinal conclusion is supported by:
- Colossians 3:23 Whatever you do, continuously perform your work [static present middle imperative of ἐργάζομαι (ergázomai)] from your soul, as for the Lord rather than for men,
- v. 24 knowing that from the source of the Lord you shall receive in return the reward of the inheritance. It is the Lord Christ whom you serve.
- v. 25 For he who does wrong will receive back the consequences for the things he has done wrong, and that without partiality. (EXT)
 - 31. Part of passing system testing is to avoid the psychological traps that injustice can solicit.
 - 32. The context of this paragraph places the believer in the status of a slave under the authority of a slave master.
 - 33. In modern parlance, the arrangement would be an employee under the authority of an employer but other examples are also applicable.
 - 34. The implication in verse 25 is that the employer has been unfair and unjust with his employee.
 - 35. This association can be expanded to reference any system that has individuals in authority over others.
 - 36. Consequently, it is common for there to be injustice by those who are in authority in any given system.
 - 37. God does not support this circumstance but He, in eternity past, observed it and therefore decreed that it would occur.
 - 38. God does not support the machinations of the human lust patterns, sinful decisions, or evil intentions.
 - 39. If free will is truly free, then God from His integrity allows it to remain free.
 - 40. Consequently, individuals will often find themselves in an intractable situation in which they are victims of evil men's dominance.
 - 41. The divine instruction in this passage to the oppressed individual is to "continuously perform his work from the source of his soul."
 - 42. The orientation one must adjust to is that he does not work for his earthly authority but rather for the Lord Christ.
 - 43. Among the data recorded in the divine decree are not only those made by the believer in this circumstance but also those made by his antagonist.
 - 44. God will reward the believer for allowing divine justice to manage the situation rather than intervening with human-viewpoint problem-solving devices.

- 45. When we submit to our circumstances, we allow the Lord to administer justice where it belongs; discipline for the corrupt employer and reward the employee.
- 46. This reward is eternal. It is of far greater value than any of the assumed advantages gained by reactionary efforts against the antagonist.
- 47. The key concept that enables a person to effectively orient and adjust to momentum tests concludes verse 24, "It is the Lord Christ whom you serve."
- 48. The next category of momentum testing is disaster. Two categories are prominent: (1) personal and (2) historical.
- 49. Personal disaster testing is designed to accelerate one's spiritual momentum or serve as a warning for involvement in the Dark Side.
- 50. Categories of personal disaster include: physical or mental pain, being victimized by crime, persecution, restriction of basic necessities, loss of personal possessions, or loss of one's reputation, finances, or health.
- 51. There are natural phenomena that accompany national disaster: extreme heat or cold, drought, flood, storms, tornados, hurricanes, earthquakes, and volcanic eruptions.
- 52. National disaster also includes cultural phenomena: violence, crime, terrorism, drug abuse, murder, rape, child abuse and molestation, corruption, theft, and perversion.
- 53. National discipline includes all of these plus the loss of personal freedoms, economic recession and depression, breakdown of law and order, warfare, separation of families, and general disorder.
- 54. Prosperity testing also has two categories: (1) individual and (2) collective.
- 55. Individual prosperity testing includes personal advancement and success, assisted by education, knowledge, talent, ability, circumstances, and perseverance. Many believers allow the accouterments of earthly prosperity to become a distraction to the daily intake of Bible doctrine.
- 56. When a large number of believers enjoy soul prosperity, then blessing by association benefits the entire commonwealth.
- 57. Prosperity results in modern advancements that are collectively utilized by a high percentage of the population.
- 58. It is normal for unbelievers and Christians with little or no doctrine to become disinterested in the importance of Bible study.
- 59. The gradual loss of thought permits the intrusion of licentiousness into the body politic. When the cultural base becomes too weak to maintain order, the general trend is toward hedonism.
