The Attackers: Memory Center: Genitive with the Noun of Action: the Love of God cf. the Love for God; Vocabulary Storage: Basis for Thought; Doctrine Stored in Neural Dictionary for Recall

- (50) When we know the love *of* Christ then we have gone past academic perception of the Word of God and moved doctrine into the stream of consciousness.
- (51) From this inventory we have stored a sophisticated understanding of the love *of* God from which we respond with reciprocal love toward Him.
- (52) It is this advance that takes us all the way to the high ground of πλήρωμα (*plērōma*), the level of spiritual maturity where we enjoy escrow blessings in time.
- (53) This advance can only occur if we become sophisticated in our unconditional love for others.
- (54) That unconditional love must be preceded by reciprocal love *for* God and Christ is reflected in the objective genitive of the phrase ἡ ἀγαπή τοῦ Θεοῦ (hē agape tou Theou): the love *for* God.
- (55) Inculcation of doctrine educates the believer about the love *of* God which, through spiritual growth, results in reciprocal love *for* God.
- (56) For spiritual growth to occur there must be retention of things taught so that the developing memory traces, associations, and constellations can be recalled.
- (56) Therefore, consistency of inculcation is an imperative since the rate of learning must always exceed the rate of forgetting.
- (57) When this is the case, one's *epignōsis* understanding steadily increases in the frame of reference and memory center.

- (58) When the Holy Spirit brings a believer to the point of *epignōsis* understanding of a doctrine, He transfers it to the memory center while simultaneously cataloging the information into the memory traces of the brain.
- (59) Recall is absolutely necessary for the function of the double-column advance: for spiritual growth to continue there must be simultaneous motivation from one's reciprocal love for God.
- (60) Recall from doctrine in the soul is essential for one's application to life and circumstances. Instant recall facilitates right thought, decision, action, and timing.
- (61) The memory center is the compartment of the stream of consciousness that circulates doctrine from the frame of reference to the other five compartments.

**Psalm 119:16** - I shall delight in Your statutes; I shall not forget your Word.

## 3. Vocabulary Storage:

- (1) It is impossible for a person to think beyond the capacity of his vocabulary. Words, their definitions, and proper usage are imperative to decisionmaking.
- (2) The ability to maintain an inventory of words, terms, and phrases is made possible by the mentality of the soul which coordinates with the memory center to retain a neural dictionary.
- (3) A person's progress in the study of the Bible is dependent upon the size of his vocabulary. As the pastor teaches, he must use words that precisely convey the ideas revealed in Scripture.

- (4) The Bible is written primarily in Hebrew and Koine Greek. The pastor must mine the manuscripts to dig out what the writer meant when he wrote it and how those who read what he wrote understood it.
- (5) The result must then be communicated in the English language so that the same result occurs in the souls of those who attend Bible class.
- (6) The most technical concepts that the human mind can encounter is the information contained in Scripture, for it is there that is found the thinking, logic, and rationales of our omniscient God.
- (7) The difficulty of calculating divine thought is made easy by the filling, teaching, retention, and recall ministries of the Holy Spirit.
- (8) However, the Holy Spirit can bring the proper meaning only to those who have an adequate enough vocabulary to understand what is taught.
- (9) In Operation Z, the Holy Spirit teaches doctrinal concepts to the believer's human spirit where academic understanding of the subject is then transferred to the soul where volition must consider whether to believe or reject the information.
- (10) An individual's evaluation of the divinely exposed principle is limited by the size of his vocabulary. It is possible for a positive believer to receive an idea in his *nous* that he simply does not grasp because he doesn't have the vocabulary to properly analyze it.
- (11) This is alright. Spiritual growth depends on the development of memory traces, associations, and constellations of doctrine and as these are being enlarged, greater understanding gradually occurs.
- (12) As doctrines are learned, mnemonic devices are utilized to assist the believer's recall.

(13) The English word *mnemonic* \ni-mä'-nik\ is defined as "a technique for improving the memory" (M-WCD-11), and "a device such as a pattern of letters, ideas, or associations that assists in remembering something" (NOAD).
