Cain's Murder of Abel – John 8:44 cf.

Genesis 4:3-5, 8; 1 John 3:11-12; Jude 11a (NASB)

- Genesis 4:3 It came about in the course of time that Cain brought an offering to the Lord of the fruit of the ground.
- v. 4 Abel, on his part also brought of the firstlings of his flock and of their fat portions. And the Lord had regard for Abel and for his offering;
- v. 5 but for Cain and for his offering He had no regard. So Cain became very angry and his countenance fell.
- v. 8 Cain told Abel his brother. And it came about when they were in the field, that Cain rose up against Abel his brother and killed him.
- 1 John 3:11 This is the message which you have heard from the beginning, that we should love one another;
- v. 12 not as Cain, who was of the evil one and slew [σφάζω ($spház\bar{o}$): to slaughter an animal for sacrifice] his brother. And for what reason did he slay him? Because his deeds were evil, and his brother's were righteous.
- **Jude 11a** Woe to them! For they have gone the way of Cain ...
