7. His underlying mind-set was not jealousy, but envy, "If I am not going to have the power, then you aren't either."

2 Samuel 15:6 Consequently, Absalom functioned under this rationale. All who approached the castle, he intervened and with his engaging personality, he stole the hearts of the men of Israel. (EXT)

Summary:

- 1. The government of Israel is in chaos. An interloper, even one of royal blood, is able to undermine the system when the man on the throne is disengaged from what is going on around him.
- 2. This was not a new situation for David. His obvious loss of thought became starkly evident when he ignored Amnon's rape of his daughter, Tamar. She was Absalom's sister.
- 3. Absalom rightly thought that surely David would punish his brother Amnon's crime. When David did nothing at all, Absalom began a thought process in his soul that led to the drama that proceeded over the course of almost a decade.
- 4. He was first appalled, then furious, then vindictive, then murderous. During all these events, David did nothing.
- 5. Who was David exactly? He was the first king of Israel from the royal line of Judah, the bloodline of Messiah. He was commander-in-chief of its military. His early reign was filled with his dependence on the God of Israel as he defended the domain of the priest nation.
- 6. Prosperity emerged from his leadership. Enemies were subdued and defeated. The people lived in an environment of peace. This led to prosperity testing.
- 7. When good decisions result in an abundance of blessings beginning with peace throughout the commonwealth, far too often the people forget the fact that it is God, His Word, His promises, and His protection that enables prosperity to occur and continue.
- 8. Conversely a collective loss of thought caused chaos to occur in Israel. The loss of thought emerged from the castle all the way through the country so that the safety and prosperity once enjoyed was being withdrawn.
- 9. Principle: There is nothing new under the sun.
- 10. However, there is a reckoning coming down like a mighty stream in client nation America. The Progressives have envisioned nirvana but have unleased chaos.

- 11. The Lord is not pleased with its ever-advancing decline. The Invisible Enemy stalks the land mysteriously recruiting clueless assassins who innocently pick off random victims in the clear light of day.
- 12. Any believer who has studied doctrine for more than a year knows the principles associated with client-nation status. God promotes believers with doctrinal principles who found a client nation.
- 13. Israel is the biblical example of several priest nations enjoyed by the Jews. On every occasion each failed and did so violently.
- 14. There are reasons for these examples of national demise whose root cause can be summed up with the phrase, "loss of thought."
- 15. Warnings about this predictable demise are the five cycles of discipline. If they had been observed objectively, then corrective decisions designed to restore order would have been employed.
- 16. Yet ignored and the priest nation was taken down by a predator nation.
- 17. Presently, the United States is engaged in at least the third cycle with the potential dangers of four and five to follow. The major predator that has the means, the power, and the ability to launch a major assault on our nation has conceivably already been deployed.
- 18. The coronavirus, Covid-19, or the Wuhan flu could very well have been created in, emanated from, and globally spread outwardly throughout the world by China. Its purpose could well have been intended to take down the only economy in the world that could successfully challenge the economy and therefore the power of the Chinese.
- 19. If the United States does not with clarity of purpose open up its economy, full bore, then its ability to return to normalcy will be severely limited.
- 20. Otherwise, the benighted will panic due to the absence of divine viewpoint and potentially, inspired by the Dark Side, to join a rebellion.
- 21. Our trust and confidence must not allow the potentiality of such circumstances to cancel our unfailing confidence in our heavenly Father and His Word, our Lord Jesus Christ Who controls history, and the Holy Spirit whose recall ministry steels our souls for facilitation and application.
- 22. It is doctrine in our souls that retains the unseen power that is greater than all the exigencies the cosmic world order has to offer. God honors His Word. His Word is truth. Those who know, rely upon, and apply truth to circumstances become the superior and overwhelming power to influence history on behalf of the client nation.

- 23. Trust in truth! Know it! Apply it! Rest on it! Truth—άλήθεια (alétheia)
 is the unseen cause and power that enables Jesus Christ to control history on behalf of the pivot and rescue our client nation from the strategies and tactics of *cosmos diabolicus*.
- 24. Our detour into the rise and fall of David's monarchy emphasized the impact Absalom had on the nation Israel. Absalom was a one-man wrecking crew whose exploits challenged the doctrinally weakened King David.
- 25. Absalom's decision-making was influenced by various mental-attitude sins that developed in his soul over a seven-year period—anger, revenge, jealousy, and ultimately envy.
- 26. Envy was the final mental-attitude sin that resulted in his demise in the Battle of Ephraim Forest. Absalom's envy was focused on David's repeated miscarriages of justice.
- 27. During his various sinful machinations, he was initially jealous of David as king, but later this was transformed onto his envy of David and his power.
- 28. Envy usually has no desire to remove the envied person from power because they want to succeed him. Envy primarily wants to see the person with power to lose it.
- 29. Absalom also wants David to suffer in the process, therefore he initiated a propaganda campaign among the Israelites to surreptitiously transfer some of David's power over to him.
- 30. In our study of the sin of envy, E. Reuter's comments regarding the difference between envy and jealousy are worth repeating:

The fact that Hebrew has only a single word to cover both aspects seems less surprising when we note, for example, that the languages of central Europe did not distinguish zeal, envy, and jealousy until after the Middle Ages. Even today the distinction is not always entirely clear.⁸

- 31. Among the major English translations of the Bible, the King James Version and the New International Version translate ζῆλος (zélos) with "envy" and "envying" respectively. The NET Bible and New American Standard both use "jealousy."
- 32. Our research has revealed that the correct translation of the noun in both 2 Samuel [ζηλος (zélos)] is "envy."
